Developing Institutional Partnerships that Promote Student Exchange between U.S. and Croatian HEIs

Time: Wednesday, 10 May 2017, from 9 am to 5 pm

The seminar is organized by the Institute for the Development of Education and the U.S. Embassy in Zagreb within the project “US Study Abroad Platform in Croatia”. The “US Study Abroad Platform in Croatia” project aims to enhance cooperation between the U.S and Croatian higher education institutions (HEIs) through two main activities: (1) organizing a one day seminar on internationalization, which would build capacity of Croatian HEIs for developing institutional partnerships and active participation in exchange with the U.S. HEIs and (2) creating the online platform containing guidelines and tools for connecting and maintaining institutional collaboration for both U.S. and Croatian institutions.

Academic internationalization is a “work in progress.” Definitions are many in number and vary by nation and speaker. This session provides a framework for sorting out the many meanings of internationalization, evaluating current debates on its goals and impact, and understanding the connection between international partnerships, study abroad, and internationalization at home. The session will address the impact of internationalization on different institutional policies and resources needed for internationalization.

This session discusses the history and current state of student mobility between the U.S. and Croatia, as well as the dramatically changing shape of study abroad for U.S. students in general. The session also identifies the mutual benefit that Croatian and U.S. institutions can receive from increasing the number of students traveling between our two nations, and the importance of institutional partnerships in building meaningful student learning experiences. The session concludes with an open discussion of challenges that must be overcome in order to increase such mobility.

This session explores strategies for building platforms that support and encourage study abroad between Croatian and U.S. institutions. It identifies what students need for a successful experience and how they can be integrated into the host institution, as well as the ways in which institutional partnerships can be used to connect faculty, provide online interaction both before and after the study abroad program, find a meeting ground between study abroad and the existing curriculum, and form the basis for new activities in the future.

3:00-4:00 The Care and Tending of International Partnerships (Susan Buck Sutton)

While international partnerships are a key element of successful internationalization, too many linkages do not achieve their potential. Without careful development and tending, partnerships remain collaborations on paper only, with little or no activity. This session identifies best practices for initiating effective partnerships and sustaining them over time, so that they become long-term platforms for student learning, as well as mutual institutional growth and development.
